



What is the size of the population 15-24?

- In 2013, there were
 - 19.3 M youth in the Philippines
- · Of these,
 - 10.3 M were aged 15-19
 - 9.0 M were aged 20-24



While the size of the youth population 15-24 is increasing, its percent share of the total population has remained more or less stable at 20 percent.




Number and percent of youth population: Philippines and NCR





Survey design

- Sampling domain: Region
- Sample size per region: About 1,000 respondents
- Sampling design:
 - Multistage, stratified random sampling;
 - In each region, barangays were stratified into S, M, L with the size of the youth population as the stratification variable;
 - Within each stratum, barangays were selected with probability proportional to the population size;
 - In each barangay, 15 HHs were selected using systematic random sampling;
 - All eligible members of the sample household (15-24 years old)
 were interviewed.




Education profile of NCR youth

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF YOUTH BY HIGHEST EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT



























Low and declining appeal of traditional media among NCR youth

 - 22.9% in 2002













NCR has the highest proportion of currently smoking youth at 27%








Proportion of youth who ever used drugs


















... and the highest regional proportion of youth who ever attempted suicide in the country.







SUMMARY

- Profile of NCR youth:
 - The best regional education profile registering the highest % of youth who have at least some college education;
 - Among the top regions in terms of the % who are currently studying (2nd) but at the same time is among those with high level of unemployed (4th);
 - The highest % who are living-in;
 - the lowest who are formally married.

SUMMARY

- · Media exposure of the NCR youth:
 - Low and declining use of traditional media forms like newspapers and magazines although TV viewership remains high (91%)
 - Very high use of new information technology
 - NCR youth are technology savvy as shown in the highest regional percentage distribution:
 - Internet use (92%)
 - Duration of internet use (10 hours/week vs. 6 at the national level)
 - With a social media account (90%)
 - With an email account (89%)
 - With online friends who they have not met personally

SUMMARY

- Non-sexual risk behaviors of NCR youth:
 - Increasing % of currently smoking and currently drinking youth in the past two decades despite the generally declining national trend
 - NCR registered the highest regional % of youth:
 - currently smoking (27%)
 - currently drinking (56%)
 - experienced physical violence both as an aggressor and as a victim
 - experienced harassment using technology
 - NCR is among the top 5 regions with the highest proportion who:
 - ever used drugs
 - ever thought of committing suicide
 - 6% of youth attempted suicide, the highest regional record in the country
