










### More than half of Region II youth have watched xrates movies/videos







Region II has the 2<sup>nd</sup> least proportion of youth who visited websites with sexually-explicit content




# More than 1 out of 10 Region II youth have sent or received sex videos through cell phones or the internet




# Region II has the second least proportion of youth who have sent or received sex videos













### Still, 1 in 4 Region II youth have engaged in PMS







# Narrowing gap between male and female youth who engage in PMS





Condom is the most widely used method of contraception among Region II youth during first PMS






# Region II youth have also engaged in other risky sexual activities

- 2.4% have engaged in casual sex (Philippines: 7%)
- 1.2% have FUBU experience (Philippines: 4%)
- 1.2% have MSM experience (Philippines: 5%)
- None of ever-married youth (including those living-in) reported having extramarital sex experience (Philippines: 3%)
- Most of these risky sexual activities are unprotected against the risk of pregnancy and/or STIs


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
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



TV and books are the most popular sources of information about sex; More than 2 in 5 Region II youth have no source of information about sex






Friends of the same sex, medical professionals and mothers are Region II youth's most preferred sources of information about sex and reproduction







Friends and mothers are the ones most Region II youth will consult if they have questions about sex; Almost one-third will consult no one







Most Region II youth identified their classmates/friends as the ones who can help them if they have any sex-related problem







Most discussions of sex at home are between fathers and sons, mothers and daughters











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## **SUMMARY & CONCLUSIONS**

- Although generally less prevalent in Region II, there is still a heightened, bolder, and wider range of sexual behaviors among the region's youth including those that use new forms of information and communication technology (ICT)
- These new technologies have given rise to new forms of sexual activity and new means of meeting sexual partners that could increase the risk of adverse consequences, especially under a context of low prevalence in the use of protection

 The increased prevalence of sexual activity in various forms may indicate new normative standards regarding sex

- Norms around marriage may also be changing as indicated by a high proportion of those living-in which is catching up to the proportion formally married
- The narrowing of the gap in the prevalence of premarital sexual (PMS) activity between young men and women, amidst increasing PMS prevalence in general, is likely a major contributor to the sharp increase in teenage fertility

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### **SUMMARY & CONCLUSIONS**

- A significant proportion (41.1%) of young people in Region II do not have any source of information about sex
- Friends (particularly of the same sex) and mothers are the persons they will turn to if they have questions about sex or confronted with any sex-related problem
- Most Region II youth would also like to learn about sex and reproduction from friends, mothers, and medical professionals

# **SUMMARY & CONCLUSIONS**

- The substantial proportions of Region II youth who rely on themselves for information about sex is a cause for concern
- Very little discussion of sex at home
  - Most discussions of sex at home transpire between fathers and sons, and mothers and daughters
