




1 in 3 Region X youth has read pornographic materials




Rise in the prevalence of reading of pornographic materials among male youth in the past decade




More than half of Region X youth have watched x-rated movies and videos




The prevalence of watching x-rated movies/videos has risen in the past decade for both males and females





1 in 10 Region X youth has visited websites with sexuallyexplicit content











2 IN 5 youth in Region X already have sexual experience





Below-average prevalence of sexual activity among Region X youth




Younging of the sexual onset in both males and females



Increasing early sexual activity among males but decline in the past decade among females




Increasing proportions of youth who have engaged in sex before age 18






More than 1 in 5 Region X youth have engaged in premarital sex




2 in 5 NCR YOUTH have engaged in premarital sex




Narrowing gap between male and female PMS activity








Decline in the proportion of youth who have paid for sex; Rise in the proportion who have received payment for sex


More than half of Region X youth reported that they do not have any source of information about sex






Region X youth would like to learn general information about sex the most; more females than males would like to learn about contraception







Most Region X youth would consult their friends and mothers if

Majority of Region X youth reported that there is somebody in school who can help them if they have any sex-related problem








Only 7 in 100 Region X youth have discussed sex at home when they were growing up




Most discussions about sex at home are between brothers, mothers and daughters, mothers and sons








The proportion of teenage females in Region X who have begun childbearing sharply increases with age











Level of AIDS awareness among Region X youth has steeply declined in the past decade






The youth largely misunderstand HIV-AIDS




36 in 100 Region X youth think AIDS is curable

SUMMARY & CONCLUSIONS

- There is a heightened, bolder, and wider range of sexual behaviors among the youth including those that use new forms of information and communication technology (ICT)
- These new technologies have given rise to new forms of sexual activity and new means of meeting sexual partners that could increase the risk of adverse consequences, especially under a context of low prevalence in the use of protection

SUMMARY & CONCLUSIONS

- The increased prevalence of sexual activity in various forms may indicate new normative standards regarding sex
 - Norms around marriage may also be changing as indicated by a higher proportion of the living-in than the formally married not only in Region X but in the rest of the country as well
- The narrowing of the gap in the prevalence of premarital sexual (PMS) activity between young men and women, amidst increasing PMS prevalence in general, is likely a major contributor to the sharp increase in teenage fertility
